We have been working hard across the school to develop a range of important writing skills as part of our work within the School Improvement Plan. Last term, we enjoyed learning about personal and recount texts. This term we are very excited to move on to explore imaginative texts, including character, setting and structuring enjoyable and

engaging stories with twists and tension. We look forward to sharing our work with you soon!

Staff have participated in training around the genres of writing and all classes have enjoyed working with the Macastory duo, Ron and Fergus, who inspired some great writing. Teachers have been looking into film literacy exploring ways in which film can

be used to engage children in writing and how film can be used to enhance learning. We're excited to get started!

Class reading reps have been busy conducting reading surveys with their classes to ensure pupil voice informs our Reading School journey. We recently celebrated Book Week Scotland, with all classes enjoying a visit to Westerton Library. Classes participated in online events and local author,

Maura MacRobbie, shared extracts of her new book with some lucky classes. Reading volunteers read some fabulous books with our pupils and a tangible enthusiasm for reading is spreading across the school. Every class has been set the task of choosing how to spend their £60 budget to enhance their class library.
