Mary Quant Exhibition

Primary 5/6 and Primary 6 had a fantastic time at the Mary Quant exhibition at the Kelvingrove. They had great fun designing their own pieces inspired by Mary Quant's work. Both classes were a credit to the school on the train and at the Art Galleries - well done everyone! Here's a summary of the day written by the pupils.

First we went on the train to Partick, we had to squeeze in because it was so busy. It took us about 7 minutes on the train and about 15-20 minutes to walk to the art museum from Partick. When we arrived we had our snack and had some free time to explore the museum. First we looked at the animals then went through to the extinct animals section and then through to the ancient Egypt room. The room next door was information and objects from the olden days and a little area all about the rainforest. When we finished exploring we had lunch outside. There were so many pigeons so we had to go inside. After lunch we went to the gift shop and bought things like bouncy balls. Once we finished our lunch it was time for the workshop, we were looking at fashion from the 1960s because that is what we are learning about. The workshop was called 'The Mary Quant exhibition'. Mary Quant is a fashion designer from the 1960s. We looked at her designs and sketched some designs inspired by her creations. We also created a 1960s outfit. It was a great trip, we had lots of fun.



Flat Stanley's Adventures

Primary 4 have been learning about Flat Stanley and have posted Flat Stanleys all around the world.

Mrs Michie was reading books about Flat Stanley to us and we enjoyed them. We learned that he got flattened by a bulletin board when he was sleeping. He used to be an ordinary boy but now he was as thin as paper.

It has been very exciting because Flat Stanley has visited so many places. We have looked forward to receiving our letters back at the school and hearing about all of their adventures.


