regulation/nurture. We would also like to continue to engage with parents and carers through Seesaw and Sumdog. Using PEF funding we would be able to renew our subscriptions.



Vaping

Please read the following information from the Scottish Government vaping campaign which gives advice on how to talk to your child about this important issue.

In Scotland, it's illegal to sell vapes or e-cigarettes to anyone under 18, or to buy them for someone who's under 18. But this doesn't stop young people from getting hold of them. Young people are particularly vulnerable to nicotine addiction and are more likely to take health risks and discount the future consequences of this behaviour. Nicotine addiction can impact mental health, resulting in being tired, stressed and anxious and it can affect concentration and impact the ability to learn and study. E-cigarettes contain some potentially harmful chemicals, similar to those found in cigarette smoke, although at a much lower level. While the long-term effects of vaping are still being researched, it's thought they could have negative effects on the health of the heart but there is currently insufficient evidence to assess this. Getting help and support.
