With trips underway, preparations for end-of-year reports, and a calendar full of learning and celebration, it's been a busy time. We're starting with a smile as we congratulate our Primary 1 pupil who won the school joke competition with this brilliant entry: "Why did the banana put sun cream on before he went to the beach?... in case he peeled!". Well done, and thank you to all the pupils who entered with their fantastic jokes and to the House Captains who had a tough job judging.

We recently held an information session for parents on our upcoming RSHP (Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood) lessons. Thank you to all who attended. These lessons will begin soon, and class teachers will share in advance via Seesaw so you know what your child will be learning and can continue conversations at home. Your support as we deliver this important part of the curriculum is greatly appreciated.

Thank you to everyone who joined us for our recent Sharing the Learning event. It was wonderful to welcome so many families into classrooms to celebrate the fantastic work our children have been doing. The pride in their learning was clear to see, and your encouragement makes a huge difference.

We'd also like to thank everyone who took the time to share their ideas on our School Improvement Priorities for next session. One of the themes that emerged was the value of parental involvement in careers education, as many of you contributed so positively during Science Week earlier this year. We hear you—and we will look at meaningful ways to incorporate your ideas into our planning moving forward.

Last term, we launched our new school values with a whole-school competition to bring them to life through illustrations. The winning entries were revealed at our Spring Celebration Assembly, and these values will now be central to how we learn and work together as a school community. A huge well done to all the pupils who entered and helped shape the identity of our school.

We're also delighted to share that we raised £574.95 through Asda Rewards Cashpot for Schools, we've been able to purchase new bistro chairs for use during lunchtimes and outdoor learning. Pupils will love having the option of al fresco lunches when the weather allows—thank you, and thank you Asda!

To support high-quality learning across the curriculum, we have invested in two excellent online teaching resources: Language Angels, to strengthen our delivery of modern languages (MLPS), and White Rose Maths, which will support consistent and effective numeracy teaching across all stages. We're excited about the impact these tools will have on pupil learning. In addition, we've upgraded our walkie-talkie system across the school to support communication and safety throughout the day. This is a practical but important improvement and is already making a positive difference.

As we near the end of term, we are also beginning preparations to say goodbye to our Primary 7 leavers. This is a special time for them and for us as a school community. We are so proud of all they have achieved and the confident, capable individuals they are becoming. Plans are underway for a meaningful celebration of their time here before they take their next big step into secondary school—we look forward to sharing details with families soon.

Looking ahead, our Sports Day is planned for Monday 19 May 9.30am, and we hope for dry skies! If the weather is unkind, we will monitor conditions daily and aim to hold Sports Day on the next suitable day during the week. We will keep you informed as the forecast becomes clearer.

Finally, we're excited to announce that our Junior Duke participants will soon be invited to a Garden Party after school to celebrate their achievements. Invitations will be coming your way soon—we look forward to marking this accomplishment together!
