Curriculum News

Term: 3 Dates: January - March **Class: Primary 2**



Literacy and English

Reading-

We will continue to focus on tools for reading and Bloom's questioning to enhance children's understanding of class fiction texts. Reciprocal reading strategies such as predicting, questioning and summarising will continue to be built on.

Writing-

• The pupils will be using their Scotland and Dinosaur topics as a stimulus for writing. We will be discussing the differences between fiction and non-fiction texts.

Spelling-

The children will learn one new spelling sound or rhyming pattern each week. They will practise spelling words containing this sound, as well as other common and tricky words.

Talking and Listening -

This will continue to be developed across the curriculum through play and during co-• operative learning activities. Short individual talks will be carried out to develop confidence when talking to the whole class.

Mathematics

- Addition and Subtraction within 20
- Multiplication
 - Mental maths will focus on and enhance the learning of the above concepts.
- Fractions, area and directions.

Social Studies and I.C.T.

- Our Topics this term are Scotland followed by Dinosaurs.
- Word processing skills and topic related activities. Opportunities will also be available in ICT to support class literacy and numeracy topics.
